

Climate-smart disaster risk reduction saves lives by limiting the amount of risk people face and the level of damage a crisis causes. It can help communities effectively prepare for and cope with natural hazards. Philanthropic agencies such as the Mercy Corps are mobilizing a significant scale up in this approach to planning in the 40 countries in which it operates. Using satellite data for disaster preparedness/response and disaster relief reduces risk, and when disaster strikes it collapses time and space, providing internet services so that experts can access remote medical services, emergency responders can coordinate their efforts and communicate with affected populations immediately, and situational awareness so that the right relief resources can be deployed to areas most in need.
